PUBLIC COMMENTS

Sarah Allen, 324 Grant St., asked about code cases. Almond said council will contract them.

Better Badin President Jane Rife, 23 Henderson St., requested \$750 for children's treat bags and an event banner for the town's annual Christmas tree lighting. She also requested permission to install pet waste bag dispensers on Falls Road. Lowder will add that to the October agenda.

Jody Hopper, of 51 Maple St., said 32 Kirk Place burned but isn't boarded. Almond said Chief Smith spoke to the owner and it will be soon. Huntley said the owner will board it this week.

Richard Aldridge, 52 Maple St., asked why parking on town property isn't allowed. Lowder said public works can't maintain the property when cars park there. C. Council said they asked the police to move cars. Aldridge reported a pothole where cars access town property from the alley.

Kimberly Petty of 702 Roosevelt St. said her yard and home floods, damaging her fence. She said storm water carries trash to her yard, and requested to be added to the storm water project priority list. Lowder said a contractor has assessed the area and offered drainage recommendations.

David Gallimore of 90 Falls Rd. requested the town and state prohibit parking on Falls Rd. from Boyden St. to Spruce St., due to dangerously poor visibility from driveways, and affected properties have off street parking. Irene Huneycutt, of Falls Rd. agreed.

Council discussed prioritizing storm water project list. Ward said council met to prioritize the list December 2023. Almond agreed, but isn't sure it was completed. Lowder said a prioritized list was never voted on and asked council to list by next Tuesday the top five areas to contract.

Lowder said town hall carpet installation may take three days, with staff out of office. Work will be 5 p.m. Thursday with town hall closing Friday. Lowder said Almond can forward town hall phone and work remotely. Bowers' home internet prevents her. C. Council is fine if citizens can reach staff. He suggested a RAVE call so citizens know about office closure and staff availability.

Council discussed Badin Conference Center. Core project features are complete. Council reviewed list of issues and pricing. Staff grant seeking \$250,000 for project continuance was reviewed and additional information has been requested by NC Rural Economic Development Commission. Ward asked what funds are left to spend and said some work can be done in house. C. Council suggested getting the amounts and continue discussion at the Sept. 24th Special Called Meeting. Ward would like to repair the window himself by cutting pipe and closing window. Ward and Eudy will look at the door and filling in the dirt. Almond said remaining contingency fund is \$6,814. Bowers reported an additional \$2,000 will come out of that total.

Motion to table Badin Conference Center project repairs discussion until September 24 Special

Ward and Huntley marked items in Badin Conference Center for disposal, Robin Sage trainees loaded items into dump truck, and public works hauled to landfill.

Council received Badin Bunny Egg Hunt special event application from Better Badin. Lowder said Better Badin's Certificate of Insurance will be out of date by the event but they will renew.

Council received Loch Badin Celtic Festival application from Better Badin. Jane Rife spoke to NC ABC Commission and Better Badin won't need ABC permit. A vendor will sell alcohol on

Falls Rd. with ABC permit. Town ordinance prohibits alcohol consumption on Falls Rd., which will close for event, so Better Badin needs town permission for open alcohol on Falls Road. Almond suggested council decide if they want to allow it, then contact NCDOT for state road use.

Motion to approve Loch Badin Celtic Festival special event application with eligible requirements, waive permit fee for 501(c)3 and allow alcohol in festival if NCDOT allows: Ward Second: Huntley

Vote: Passed/Unanimous

Council discussed traffic management in Falls Rd. Central Business District from Boyden St. to Hwy 740. New business on Falls Rd. along with increased patronage to existing businesses has changed traffic patterns. Town may request markings for downtown parking on state road, but must fund markings. Council reviewed parking options from state parking guides.

Motion to present DOT with proposed Falls Road striping plan and seek funding: Huntley

Second: C. Council Vote: Passed/Unanimous

Council discussed resident request for parking prohibition on Falls Rd. from Boyden St. to Spruce St. Residents of Falls Rd. and Spruce St. reported dangerous on-street parking on Falls. Visibility and lane blocking problems from parallel parked cars leaving one-lane travel are main complaints from Maple St. to Spruce St. Almond suggested a public hearing and a proposed ordinance to review. He will draft a resolution for NCDOT and advertise public hearing.

PUBLIC WORKS:

Almond reported the following:

- Started boom mowing.
- Thanked Jane Rife for weeding Wood St. median.
- Town Cleanup will be Oct. 14-18, items may be placed in prior week by Oct. 13.

Lowder said Rife reported weeds in Wood St. median are in seed, and it needs Preen and mulch. Huntley suggested asking contracted services keep up the median. Eudy said they will thin it out.

POLICE REPORT:

- Chief Smith reported 2,576 calls for service in August.
- Officer Peck will switch to part-time effective Oct. 1st.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Almond presented financial report ending Sept. 6, 2024. August revenue from property tax, sales & use tax, occupancy tax. He is concerned for a shortfall in budgeted sales & use tax revenue.

Town Council discussed West Badin Park restroom project funding, requested PARTF checklist.
